Following these guidelines will expedite processing and publication of your paper

For revision or resubmission, to expedite publication, please upload separate production-ready files of your manuscript text (with captions, tables, and references) and figures and supporting information.

A clean, final Manuscript file in Word or LaTeX, with all changes accepted, using the [templates](#), *not* a PDF, and including:

- A title page, with the title, authors, affiliations, and three key points.
- Descriptive headings for key sections.
- An abstract that is <250 words, or <150 words for *Geophysical Research Letters*.
- Check the length: For submission to *GRL*, papers *must* be less than [12 publication units](#) or will be returned. Excess fees are charged after 25 publication units for research articles in other journals (except for *Reviews of Geophysics*)
- Tables and their captions at the end, followed by all figure captions.
- No footnotes in the text.
- Complete references—every reference must be available publicly online or in print before a paper can be accepted; there should be no “unpublished” or “in press” references.
- Acknowledgements section that includes.
 - A statement indicating where readers can access or find the data supporting the analysis and conclusions (see AGU’s data policy [here](#) and FAQ [here](#)).
 - All funding information from each author pertaining to this work.
 - Conflicts of interest for any author that are not apparent from their affiliations or funding.

Figures should be uploaded as separate files.

- Each figure should be one file only that includes all parts.
- Acceptable formats are JPG, TIFF, EPS, or PDF. Figures should be at least 300 dpi at final size.

Supporting Information should include other data, images or figures, methods text, and resources needed to support or explain the results. It should not include discussion or critical analysis. All references should be cited in the main text and reference list. Please:

- Use the AGU Supporting Information templates available [here](#) (Word) or [here](#) (LaTeX) and include text, captions, and figures as part of one Supporting Information file, in PDF format.
- Include large data tables as separate supporting Excel or .csv files, not as part of the manuscript or main supporting information file, or follow [best practices](#) and deposit these to repositories.
- Include any analysis or discussion as part of the main manuscript, not supporting information.

To submit a revision or resubmission, you will need the files above and:

- A redlined manuscript (Word or PDF) showing changes from the previous version.
- A file (Word or PDF) giving a detailed response to the reviews.
- An optional cover letter explaining your revision to the editor and noting any change in authorship (this will be copied/pasted into the submission form).
- Copies of any related manuscripts from any of the co-authors that are related to this paper and not yet published. If there are any companion manuscripts at this or any other journal, please provide an update in your cover letter on their status and the latest versions.

AGU Encourages and Endorses:

- All authors to register for an [ORCID](#); we will upload published contributions and reviews to your profile. Each author can easily create or link your ORCID in GEMS. An ORCID is now required for all corresponding authors.
- Use of International Geo Sample Numbers ([IGSN’s](#)) to identify all relevant samples. IGSN’s will be linked in the final paper.
- Following [best practices](#) and depositing data into domain repositories, or other public repositories (for a list see <https://copdessdirectory.osf.io/>). Citations to archived data should be included in your reference list.
